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Purpose Statement

The Secretary of Agriculture, assisted by the Deputy Secretary, Under and Assistant Secretaries, and members of their immediate staffs, directs and coordinates the work of the Department. This involves providing policy direction for all areas of the Department's responsibilities including research, educational and regulatory activities, nutrition, conservation and farm programs, forestry, and international agriculture. It also involves maintaining relationships with organizations and others in the development of programs and maintaining liaison with the Executive Office of the President and members of Congress on all matters pertaining to Departmental policy.

The Office of the Secretary (OSEC) also oversees special projects that are conducted at the behest of the Congress. These projects include short-term studies, investigations, and research on matters affecting agriculture or the agricultural community. Project results are reported to the appropriate Congressional Committees.

The general authority of the Secretary to supervise and control the work of the Department is contained in the Organic Act (7 U.S.C. 2201-2202). The delegation of regulatory functions to the Department employees and authorization of appropriations to carry out these functions are contained in 7 U.S.C. 450c-450g. The authority of the Secretary to streamline and reorganize the Department is contained in the Federal Crop Insurance Reform and Department of Agriculture Reorganization Act of 1994, Public Law 103-354.

As of September 30, 2016, there were 130 full-time employees, of whom 68 were permanent full-time and 62 were other than permanent full-time employees. Of the employees, 129 are located in the headquarters office and one in a field office.

The Office of the Secretary did not have any Office of Inspector General or Government Accountability Office evaluation reports during the past year.

For necessary expenses of the Office of the Secretary, [\$45,555,000] \$42,064,000, of which not to exceed [\$5,051,000] \$4,859,000 shall be available for the [immediate] Immediate Office of the Secretary [, of which not to exceed \$250,000 shall be available for the Military Veterans Agricultural Liaison;]; not to exceed [\$502,000] \$501,000 shall be available for the Office of Tribal Relations; not to exceed [\$1,496,000] \$1,448,000 shall be available for the Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Coordination; not to exceed [\$1,209,000] \$1,171,000 shall be available for the Office of Advocacy and Outreach; not to exceed [\$25,928,000] \$23,303,000 shall be available for the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Administration, of which [\$25,124,000] \$22,501,000 shall be available for Departmental Administration to provide for necessary expenses for management support services to offices of the Department and for general administration, security, repairs and alterations, and other miscellaneous supplies and expenses not otherwise provided for and necessary for the practical and efficient work of the Department; not to exceed [\$3,869,000] \$3,521,000 shall be available for the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Congressional Relations to carry out the programs funded by this Act, including programs involving intergovernmental affairs and liaison within the executive branch; and not to exceed [\$7,500,000] \$7,261,000 shall be available for the Office of Communications: Provided, That the Secretary of Agriculture is authorized to transfer funds appropriated for any office of the Office of the Secretary to any other office of the Office of the Secretary: Provided further. That no appropriation for any office shall be increased or decreased by more than 5 percent: Provided further, That not to exceed \$11,000 of the amount made available under this paragraph for the [immediate] Immediate Office of the Secretary shall be available for official reception and representation expenses, not otherwise provided for, as determined by the Secretary: *Provided further*. That the amount made available under this heading for Departmental Administration shall be reimbursed from applicable appropriations in this Act for travel expenses incident to the holding of hearings as required by 5 U.S.C. 551-558: Provided further, That funds made available under this heading for the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Congressional Relations may be transferred to agencies of the Department of Agriculture funded by this Act to maintain personnel at the agency level [:Provided further, That no funds made available under this heading for the Office of Assistant Secretary for Congressional Relations may be obligated after 30 days from the date of enactment of this Act, unless the Secretary has notified the Committees on Appropriations of both Houses of Congress on the allocation of these funds by USDA agency: Provided further, That within 180 days of the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit to Congress the report required in section 7 U.S.C. 6935(b)(3)].

Justification of Increases and Decreases

Base funding for the Office of the Secretary is necessary to ensure continued policy direction for all areas of the Department including research, educational and regulatory activities, nutrition, conservation, farm groups, forestry, and international agriculture; maintain relationships with organizations and others in the development of programs; and maintain liaisons with the Executive Office of the President and members of Congress on all matters pertaining to Department policy. In addition to Departmental Administration funding used for human resources operational services, current year and budget year base funds will also be used to support expedited and enhanced classification, staffing and processing efforts.

(1) A net decrease of \$524,000 and one staff year (\$17,191,000 and 64 staff years available in 2017).

The funding change is requested for the following items:

a. An increase of \$191,000 for pay costs (\$47,000 for annualization of the 2017 pay increase and \$144,000 for the 2018 pay increase).

The proposed funding level is needed to cover pay and benefit cost increases for staff in order to maintain the current level of service and to ensure adequate leadership, guidance, and policy direction for the Department.

b. A decrease of \$160,000 and 1 staff year for unfilled vacant positions.

A critical vacancy will remain open within the Office of Congressional Relations, and functions of the position will be performed by onboard employees.

c. A decrease of \$555,000 for non-personnel costs.

Reduction will come from agency expenses such as travel, supplies, and equipment.
