Question1: A minor part would be to insure that all imports to the U.S. meet the same standards as what the U.S. Producer must meet.

Question2: The current situation with the unavailability to obtain land is due to several factors. One is the fact of the "three permitted entity rule" the cause individuals to enter into entites to maixmize the payments they can receive. This cause higher cash lease prices. The fact that payments do not connect individual social security numbers is a problem. The fact that non-ag ownership is taking land out of production is a problem.
