Question4: Environmental Services markets and opportunities have been unrealized in USA. The UN FAO tracks forest cover as a key indicator of community health, as do many other entities. Provision of services, rather than goods, from trees and forests, including carbon sequestration, air quality improvement, heat island mitigation, and water quality improvement provide increased opportunities for market participation and environmental stewardship. Programming to qualify and quantify the benefits of forests and trees, particularly in urban areas where most of the US population reside, and to increase urban tree canopy cover would provide increased relevance and benefit to citizens.
