Question1: To eliminate the unintended consequences from farm program payments driving up cash rent and inflating land prices, farm payments should be based on production. The next farm bill should require all farmers who sign up to be on crop shares between the tenant and landlord (example 60/40 or 50/50).

Question2: Farm policy should be designed to increase how our grain is shipped to it's final market place by decreasing transportation and narrowing the basis. One such way is by buying train cars and barges to lease to famer cooperatives.

Question3: To enhance and stabilize farm prices we must curtail production. In order to do this every farm which is enrolled in the new farm program should idle up to 1/4 of that farms acres for at least one year or when prices fall below a certain level. This would eliminate over production and supply which would greatly increase prices and would eliminate price supports such as LDP's and Counter Cyclical payments. Also by ending the loan program on grain would help decrease the huge carry over in the market.

Question4: To best achieve conservation we should double the CRP acres in the next farm bill. Or pay for a certain portion of everyfarm to set idle. Which could be placed in grass out of production for the length of the farm bill.

Question5: Fedral funding should be increased to our land grant universities which could help set up programs to assit rural areas.

Question6: Increase the percentage of ethanol in gas and require vehicles to burn E-85 which is from the midwest not the mideast.
