Question1: Subsidize start up costs for small farms, especially those promoting organic, sustainable practices; promote zoning of designated farmland.

Question2: We should stop the practices that make our products undesirable to various markets- the use of growth hormones and overuse of antibiotics in livestock; inhumane intensive confinement systems such as veal crates, battery cages, and sow gestation pens; feeding poultry floor sweepings, animal derived products and other unnatural offal to cattle; and promoting genetically engineered plant products to countries that don't want them.

Question3: Limit the size of farms eligible for subsidies; do not give subsidies to farms that use intensive livestock confinement systems, produce excessive amounts of pollution, or degrade the land; set an upper limit of \$250,000 for subsidies per farm and farm owner.

Question4: Promote organic agriculture and discourage the use of polluting pesticides and fertilizers; eliminate intensive livestock confinement systems; encourage partnerships between farmers and environmental groups.

Question5: Protect farmland through zoning; protect small farmers by eliminating subsidies to large operations; promote the use of computers and new technologies on small farms; promote the production of biodiesel and other emerging products; encourage value-added products.

Question6: Promote attention to product quality and new attributes; promote organic and specialty crops; encourage value-added products, including renewable energy and bioproducts.
