Question1: Farmers have to be able to make a profit. Inheritance taxes need to be less punitive to the next generation of farmer, and current use property taxation would be beneficial. Because of inflation, an inheritance can look to be worth more than it is and the ceiling should be raised to reflect inflation.

Question2: Producers from other countries importing to the U.S. have to be held to the same environmental standards as U.S. producers in regards to pesticide use, discharge of waste, required animal inoculations, etc.

Question3: Right now, monies are pumped into certain sectors like corn and cotton, whereas producers of other products are left out, even though their products are just as good -- or better. Funding should go to underserved areas and farms/regions that can demonstrate economic need. Programs like the NRCS \$10 million to assist limited resource and beginning farmers should continue.

Question4: Education about conservation practices and help subsidizing conservation practices needs to be funded.

Question5: Have enough people in the field with the correct expertise to do on-site consultation and prepare conservation plans.

Question6: Give enough funding to universities in each state for research that will be helpful to that particular region. Farm bill funding should cover product development and marketing efforts through technical providers to NRCS.
