Question1: Limit the benefits on a per-farmer basis

Question2: Emphasize Organic cultivation, the fastest-growing portion of agriculture markets

Question3: Current stabilization policies are not appropriate for Organic producers, as the price is stabilized below the usual price for organic products. This discourages farmers who might otherwise consider organic practices. The stabilization prices should be lowered immediately, with an eye to eventual elimination.

Question4: Concentrated animal feedlot operations are a huge source of pollution, and should no longer receive USDA support. Reintegrating livestock with plant crops would lower runoff and overall water use, while promoting healthier soils.

Question5: Smaller farms would mean more farmers, which would revive rural small towns, thereby establishing potential for a new rural culture.

Question6: The market doesn't need to expand; it needs to transform. Rising oil prices are going to favor small producers who have taken care of their soil. A farm policy which encourages organic agriculture is our country's best shot at a safe, reliable food supply.
