question1: Barriers to Free Trade should be lowered in fully developed markets, sensitive markets should be excepted, and companies like Dole should be restricted in their ability to flood countries like Jamaica with bananas and powdered milk, and other market goods which destroy the farming industry in Jamaica and prevent them from developing markets for their own products within their own country.
