1) Support the entitlement structure of the Food Stamp Program (which responds to increases in need whether due to economic changes or disasters); 2) Make benefit allotments adequate (increase both the minimum benefit and other allotment levels); 3) Expand eligibility to more needy people left out of the program now (including by serving all otherwise eligible legal immigrants, able-bodied adults who now face time limits, ex drug felons making new starts, and others struggling to make ends meet); 4) Liberalize resource rules; 5) Streamline enrollment operations; 6) Increase reimbursements (match rates) for state administrative operations; 7) Support food stamp outreach; 8) Continue to allow recipients choice among food purchases and support healthy choices through nutrition education; 9) Continue Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) delivery; and 10) Rename the program to reflect recent modernization and reforms.
