Question1: No comment.

Question2: Europe and other parts of the world are increasingly focused on non-genetically-modified (non-GM) foods. We should enhance our support for non-GM foods through funding research and trade efforts for non-GM agricultural products.

Question3: Having a decreasing number of large companies control an increasing fraction of our nation's food supply is a worrisome trend.

One goal of our farm policy should therefore be to strengthen family farms, by having fewer support benefits go to larger farm businesses than to smaller ones. (Larger and more diverse ones are typically better able to weather price fluctuations anyway.) This may result in market inefficiencies, but the price is worth it for something as important as our food supply.
