







Global wheat production responds to high prices




Rice prices to remain high relative to historical levels



Growth in corn use for ethanol slows




Profitability returns to ethanol production




China soybean imports now account for 54% of global trade




Argentina and Brazil soy production losses set the stage for 2009/10




Global oilseed stocks rebuild after 2-year decline




U.S. Domestic Soybean Oil-based Biodiesel Production Margin




Global cotton use exceeds production for 4th straight year




Global cotton ending stocks lowest since 2003/04




Further contraction in livestock and dairy sectors




Productivity gains offset drop in inventory


