**Tribal Consultation.** Tribal consultation is the timely, meaningful, and substantive dialogue between USDA officials who have delegated authority to consult, and the official leadership of Federally recognized Indian Tribes, or their designated representative(s), pertaining to USDA policies that may have tribal implications. Only the official leadership of Federally recognized Indian Tribes, their proxies, and designated USDA officials will be permitted to comment during the consultation portion of discussion.

**Proxies.** To designate a proxy for this consultation, Tribal Leaders are welcome to copy the attached delegation form to tribal letterhead. This designation will authorize a designee, in writing, who will attend on behalf of a Federally recognized Tribe. The delegation cannot be in perpetuity.

**Tribal Listening Session.** Any other individual from Indian Country who wishes to provide input on this topic that is <u>not</u> a Tribal Leader or designated proxy is invited to speak during the Listening Session.
