Currently, 85 percent of our country's persistent poverty counties are in rural America. More than one third of rural Americans, and one in four rural children live in poverty. Kids growing up in families earning twice the poverty threshold are nearly three times as likely as other children to have poor health, are more likely to finish two fewer years of school, and are more likely to earn half as much money in their adult lives.

Growing the economy by investing in rural communities and increasing opportunities for families is key to our Nation's future. In 2010, Secretary Vilsack established USDA's StrikeForce Initiative for Rural Growth and Opportunity to address the specific challenges associated with rural poverty. Since then, StrikeForce teams have collaborated with more than 1,500 community partners and public entities to bring targeted assistance to rural areas experiencing chronic poverty.

These efforts have invested more than \$23.5 billion to create jobs, build homes, feed kids, assist farmers and conserve natural resources across more than twenty states. In 2016, StrikeForce expanded to include Florida, Missouri, Montana, and Ohio. Now, USDA StrikeForce teams will operate in 970 counties in 25 states and Puerto Rico. Each StrikeForce project is a commitment to America's economic future.

StrikeForce At Work

New Workforce Facility in Stonewall to Strengthen Labor Force

East Mississippi Electric Power Association approached Rural Development (RD) in early 2013 concerning the possibility of receiving leveraged funds through the USDA Rural Economic Development Loan and Grant Program for the construction of a workforce center in Stonewall, Mississippi.

Stonewall has a population of 1,088 residents and is located in Clarke, a StrikeForce county. Clarke has a total population of 17,333 and an unemployment rate of 10.4%. With the hopes of building a stronger workforce, the East Mississippi Electric Power Association submitted an application for a \$1 million Rural Economic Development Loan and a \$300,000 Rural Economic Development Grant to be lent to the Clarke County Board of Supervisors.

This allotment was leveraged with approximately \$1.2 million for the construction of a 10,000 square-foot workforce center to be operated by the Jones County Junior College. The facility is centrally located and is the only post-secondary training provider within the county. Prior to this project, the Jones County Community College was operating a welding class in borrowed space at the local VoTech building, various dual-credit classes at Quitman High School, and adult education classes at the Court House Annex facility.

The new facility consists of a welding lab, an oil well construction technology program, five classrooms, a computer lab, and several offices. Students will also have access to high-speed internet training connected directly back to the main campus. This facility will be a tremendous benefit for the residents of Clarke County. During the opening, Clarke County Supervisors and Jones County Junior College officials acknowledged that USDA was instrumental in making this project happen.


