Todd H. Kuethe is a Clinical Assistant Professor of Land Economics at the TIAA-CREF Center for Farmland Research in the Department of Agricultural and Consumer Economics at the University of Illinois. Todd conducts research on farm real estate markets, farm management, and agricultural policy. He has published more than 25 scholarly articles in leading field journals, including *American Journal of Agricultural Economics*, *Land Economics*, and *Regional Studies*, and is also a regular contributor to University of Illinois' *farmdocDaily*. His work has been profiled in a number of major media outlets including the Wall Street Journal, USA Today, New York Times, Washington Post, The Economist, National Public Radio, and VICE. His research has been recognized by awards from the Agricultural and Applied Economics Association, North American Regional Science Council, and the Lincoln Institute of Land Policy. Prior to joining the University of Illinois, Todd spent several years as an Economist with the USDA Economic Research Service in Washington, DC where he contributed to a number of USDA reports on farm real estate markets and agricultural policy. Todd earned a PhD in Agricultural Economics from Purdue University (2009), and MS in Agribusiness Economics from Southern Illinois University (2005), and a BS in Economics from The John Cook School of Business at Saint Louis University (2003).
