Tom Brown is an economist with the Rocky Mountain Research Station, U.S. Forest Service, and a faculty affiliate at Colorado State University. He holds a BA in economics from American University and a MS and Ph.D. in water management and economics from the University of Arizona. His research focuses on methodology for economic valuation of natural resources, and on environmental, economic, and institutional aspects of water resource management. Recent work includes an assessment of past and projected water use in the United States, and an assessment of threats to water quality from nonpoint sources. He has published extensively in scientific journals, has authored the book *Instream Flow Protection: Seeking a Balance in Western Water Use*, on the law, policy, history, and economics of water management in the Western U.S., and edited the text *A Primer on Nonmarket Valuation*.
