Steve Gabriel is currently the Farm Credit Administration's (FCA) chief economist. He was appointed to that position in March 2012. He previously served as program manager for systemic risk analysis in FCA's Office of Examination. Gabriel worked at the FCA for about 11 years before spending 6 ½ years at the FDIC from 2000 to 2006, where he worked as a senior financial economist. He rejoined the FCA in December 2006. Prior to working at the FCA and the FDIC, he was an agricultural economist at the Economic Research Service at USDA. He has a BA in economics from Loyola University of Chicago; an MS in finance from the University of Illinois and a Ph.D. in agricultural economics from the University of Illinois.
