)	CONSENT DECISION AND
	Respondents.)	ORDER AS TO RICHARD MYERS

This proceeding was instituted under the Horse Protection Act (15 U.S.C. § 1821 et seq.) (HPA or Act), by a complaint filed by the Administrator, Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service, United States Department of Agriculture (APHIS), on December 23, 2016, alleging that the respondents violated the Act.

Respondent Richard Myers admits the jurisdictional allegations in the complaint, specifically admits that the Secretary has jurisdiction in this matter, neither admits nor denies the remaining allegations, and waives oral hearing and further procedure. The parties consent and agree to the entry of this decision for the purpose of settling this proceeding as to respondent Richard Myers, and resolving any and all other alleged or potential violations of the Act by him occurring up to and including August 15, 2018. Respondent Richard Myers waives any action under the Equal Access to Justice Act of 1980 (5 U.S.C. § 504 et seq.) in connection with this proceeding. This decision is entered pursuant to the consent decision provisions of the Rules of Practice applicable to this proceeding (7 C.F.R. § 1.138).

Findings of Fact

1. Respondent Richard "Dick" Myers is an individual residing in and at all times mentioned herein was a "person" and an "exhibitor," as those terms are defined in the regulations promulgated under the Act (9 C.F.R. Parts 11 and 12).

2. On or about August 31, 2013, respondent Richard Myers entered a horse (Catfish Hunter) for showing in class 171 in a horse show in Shelbyville, Tennessee.

Conclusion of Law

Respondent Richard Myers having admitted the findings of fact set forth above, and the parties having agreed to the entry of this decision, such decision will be entered.

Order

Respondent Richard Myers is disqualified for four months, beginning September 2, 2018, and ending January 1, 2019, from showing, exhibiting, or entering any horse, directly or indirectly through any agent, employee, or other device, and from judging, managing or otherwise participating¹ in any horse show, horse exhibition, or horse sale or auction, directly or indirectly through any agent, employee, or other device.

li'Participating' means engaging in any activity beyond that of a spectator in connection with a horse show, horse exhibition, or horse sale or auction, and includes, without limitation, transporting or arranging for the transportation of horses to or from equine events, personally giving instructions to exhibitors, being present in the warm-up or inspection areas, or in any area where spectators are not allowed, and financing the participation of others in equine events.

The provisions of this order shall become final and effective as of September 2, 2018. This order may be executed in counterparts. Copies of this decision shall be served upon the parties.
