He does extensive work with GIS (Geographic Information System software), having recently presented on the operational uses of GIS at a WMO-sponsored meeting in Jeju, South Korea. He has also worked for: the Maryland Department of the Environment as an air quality modeler and forecaster; NOAA's Satellite Analysis Branch as an operational meteorologist; and the National Weather Service's Climate Prediction Center, gaining valuable experience at the Joint Agricultural Weather Facility.
