Committee on Contaminants in Foods (CCCF)

Committee on Processed Fruits and Vegetables (CCPFV)

The United States, as host country of CCPFV, invites Members and Observers to participate in work by correspondence on the establishment of a work plan for the development of Codex standards for processed fruits and vegetables. The languages for this work by correspondence will be English, French, and Spanish. The specific mandate for this work is as follows:

- prioritize work on the proposals for new work and pending work on the review of the existing standards;
- prepare a work plan to address its overall work; and
- prepare recommendations for CAC41 on the establishment of electronic working groups (EWGs) to carry out standard-development work, as prioritized in the work plan, for consideration by a physical meeting of CCPFV to be held in 2019.
