SUBJECT: SNAP – Fiscal Year 2027 Cost-of-Living Adjustments

TO: All State Agencies
Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program

This memorandum provides the fiscal year (FY) 2027 Cost-of-Living Adjustments (COLA) to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) maximum allotments, income eligibility standards, and deductions. In accordance with the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008 (“the Act”), the COLAs are effective as of October 1, 2026.

Attached are FY 2027 COLAs for the 48 contiguous States and the District of Columbia (D.C.), Alaska, Guam, Hawaii, and the U.S. Virgin Islands.

The maximum allotments will increase for the 48 States and D.C., Alaska, Guam, and the U.S. Virgin Islands. The maximum allotment for a family of four in the 48 States and D.C., will be \$1,023. Maximum allotments for a family of four will range from \$1,306 to \$2,027 in Alaska. The maximum allotment for a family of four will be \$1,507 in Guam and \$1,315 in the U.S. Virgin Islands. The maximum allotment for a family of four in Hawaii will decrease to \$1,655. The minimum benefit for the 48 States and D.C. will increase to \$25.

Section 3(u)(2) of the Act outlines the process for adjusting SNAP maximum allotments by household size. This provision requires an additional 22 percent of the maximum four-person allotment per person for households of nine or more persons. It also caps the total benefits for those additional persons at 200 percent of the maximum four-person allotment. In effect, for FY 2027, this caps the maximum allotment for households with 18 or more persons at \$3,887 in the 48 States and the District of Columbia. The maximum allotment cap is different for Guam, U.S. Virgin Islands, Alaska, and Hawaii.

The shelter cap value will increase to \$769 for the 48 States and D.C. The shelter cap values for Alaska, Guam, Hawaii, and the U.S. Virgin Islands will also increase. The

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maximum homeless shelter deduction will increase to \$205.66 for the 48 States and D.C., Alaska, Guam, Hawaii, and the U.S. Virgins Islands. The standard deduction for household sizes 1 through 3 will increase to \$217 a month for the 48 States and D.C. The standard deduction amounts in Alaska, Guam, Hawaii, and the U.S. Virgin Islands will also increase.

The asset limit for households will remain unchanged for the 48 States and D.C., Alaska, Guam, Hawaii, and the U.S. Virgin Islands at \$3,000. The asset limit for households where at least one person is age 60 or older, or is disabled, will increase to \$4,750.

Regional Offices must ensure that their State agencies are aware of these changes. State agencies with questions regarding these adjustments should contact their respective Regional Office representatives.
